




## **\*Works: Alien Resurrection first play**








#### The plot

### Facehuggers



#### Leader of the pack


Remember that bit in Aliens where the geezer goes: 'What do you mean 'they cut the power?' How could they cut the power, man? They're animals!"






The queen. Am I supposed to curtsey, or what?
