Sure, back then we were smiling through gritted teeth at the prospect of a wasted licence, but now developer Argonaut has hauled it back and done the business to transform it into a stunning visual space epic that retains the xenomorphic menace of the space beasts and gives more depth and versatility to the in-game playable characters.

Now it plays like *Resident Evil* in space, which can only be a good thing, and features five playable characters and many more which you'll

meet on your lonely travels around a space ship that is heavily populated by unsympathetic predators.

There are plenty of weapons to defend yourself with, puzzles to solve, brand new areas to explore and chilling discoveries to find, such as the

seven Ripley clones scattered around the star ship Auriga. The game is now scheduled for a release in October, and we managed to talk to the developers. Catch the full interview next month.
